Personal Statement Rubric

Key purpose. In an easy to summarize way, did applicant explain why they want to go to law school? (Did they explicitly state what kind of law they want to practice?)		20	
Theme. Did applicant stick to one or two main topics/themes rather than throw too much into their personal statement? (By themes, I really mean stories – more than 2 unrelated stories can oftentimes feel chaotic).		20	
Personal. Did applicant come off as honest, sincere, vulnerable, and / or authentic? Was personal statement about them? Did reader learn something unique about the applicant's story?		10	
Sincerity. Did applicant avoid using cliché's and making statements that sound good but are actually not impressive (e.g., your school is the very best; I've always wanted to be a lawyer; etc.)		10	



Page limits. Did the essay adhere to page limits, font size, and margin requirements? (2 pages – more if school explicitly says explain why them, 11 - 12 pt font, double spaced, normal margins)	10	
Content. Did the applicant make a good use of their space? Is this the story they ought to have told/topic they should have focused on? (Questions: why law school, vision post law school?)	10	
Writing style. Was the applicant's writing style persuasive and captivating? Not boring or dull?	10	
Writing quality. Was the applicant's grammar, syntax, flow, etc. good? Did they avoid making errors?	10
